## Children Pedestrian Safety

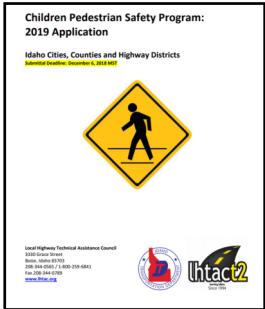
### Second Year—2019

65 Applications

Requesting \$12.7M



The CPS Program is funded through a portion of the "Surplus Eliminator."

ITD and LHTAC jointly fund the \$2M CPS Program with a 60% ITD, 40% Local split. This program awards grants up to \$250k to Local Highway Jurisdictions.

These maintenance projects focus on the impact to children pedestrians, safety, and mobility.

Applications are scored by members of the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) committee.

### Example Project Types

- Paths/sidewalks along or adjacent to an existing roadway
- Connecting sidewalks/paths between two terminal points
- Pedestrian crossing facilities across an existing roadway including signaling
- Filling a gap in the existing sidewalk inventory

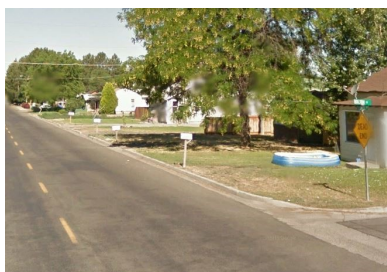

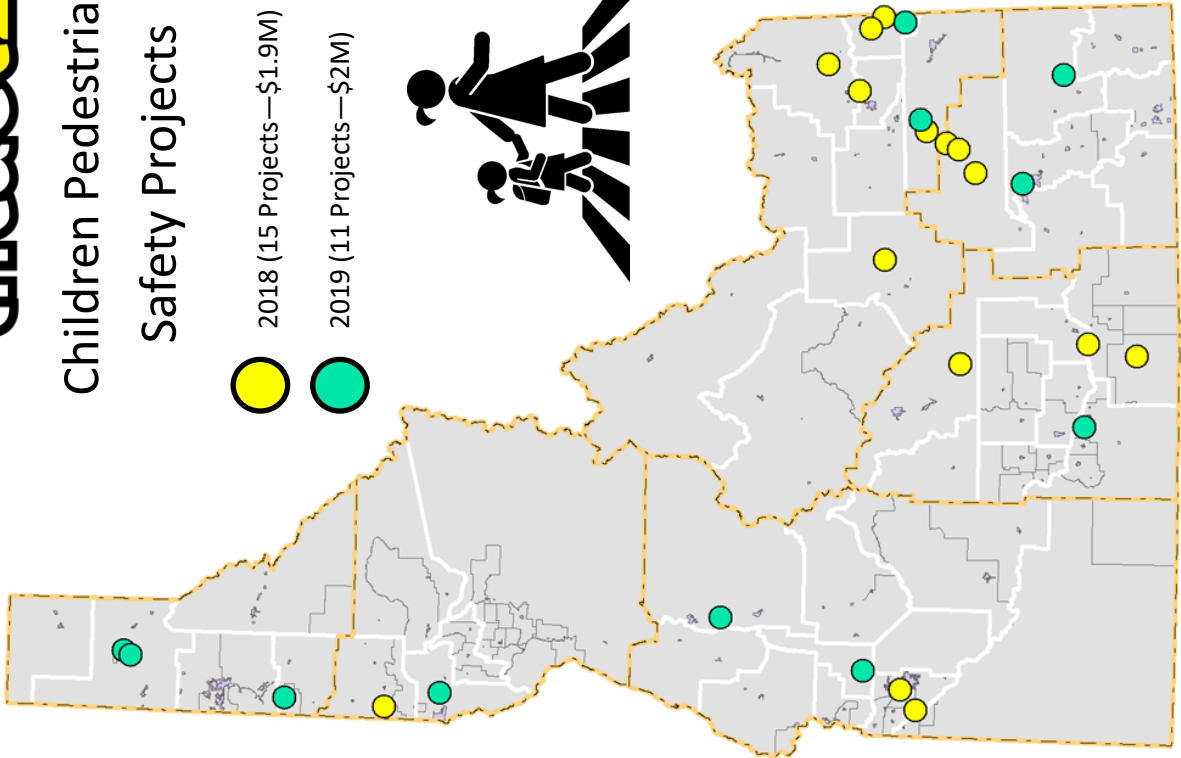
